



## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS – SCOTIABANK WOMEN AGAINST BREAST CANCER 5K CLASSIC**

1. **When does the Scotiabank Women Against Breast Cancer 5k Classic take place?**  
Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> September 2009 at 4:00 p.m. at King George V Park in Port-of-Spain and NIB Mall Car Park (obliquely opposite Scotiabank), Scarborough, Tobago. We also have an exciting aerobic warm-up preceding the race beginning at 3:30 p.m.
2. **Who will be the Emcee on Race Day?**  
The Master of Ceremonies will be Errol Fabien
3. **Who is the Patron of the Scotiabank Women Against Breast Cancer Programme?**  
Former First Lady, Mrs. Zalayhar Hassanali is the Patron of our Programme.
4. **Who is conducting the race?**  
The race is being conducted by the Trinidad and Tobago Road Runners Club.
5. **When does registration begin?**  
Registration begins on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2009 and ends on September 11<sup>th</sup> 2009.
6. **What is the registration cost this year?**  
The registration cost is \$40, but if you wish to purchase a t-shirt commemorating the 5k Classic, the cost is \$90.
7. **Can I bring my son(s) to take part in the race?**  
You can bring males to support you, if they wish to line the route. If you have (a) young son(s) who you would like to race with you, you can bring him (them) along. However, he (they) will not be able to receive a race number.
8. **I placed among the top 500 at last year's 5k. Where do I go to register?**  
Placement in the top 500 makes you a member of the Club 500 category. Registration for this category takes place at our 1 Frederick St, Independence Square Branch.
9. **What are the race categories?**  
There are 4 categories for registration: Team (Blue Numbers), Individual (Pink Numbers), Mother/Daughter (Orange Numbers) and Club 500 (Yellow Numbers).

10. How and where can I register?

13. Where do the funds come from to host this event?

These funds are then used annually in October to pay doctors, nurses and clerks to conduct our Women Against Breast Cancer Screening Programme throughout Trinidad and Tobago. As the Bank's investment is focused on educating the public about the importance of **early detection in the fight against breast cancer**, our staff members take a hands-on approach to managing the Scotiabank Women Against Breast Cancer Screening Programme to ensure that the funds are utilized for the purpose of screening only. In fact, more than 6,900 women have benefitted from screening, mammograms and ultrasounds under this programme since 1999. We also have an independent auditing firm (KPMG) which audits the Women Against Breast Cancer Account annually.

16. How can I make additional contributions to this fund?

You can visit any Scotiabank branch and make a deposit into account #131247 at transit 74815. A deposit receipt will be given to you as confirmation that your donation has been placed in this account.

17. Why doesn't Scotiabank contribute to the Trinidad and Tobago Cancer Society when it does all this fundraising under the Scotiabank Women Against Breast Cancer Programme?

This cause is very important to us at Scotiabank and we prefer to manage the Scotiabank Women Against Breast Cancer Programme ourselves since it will be more focused and better targeted in this way. This is done with the Bank's Marketing Budget, since our Women Against Breast Cancer Fund is used strictly for our Screening Programme only.
